



## Triple P chosen by Save the Children Romania

Save the Children Romania is behind a pilot program taking Triple P to Romanian families.

The program is funded by European Economic Area (EEA) Norway, under the supervision of the Romanian government.

Thirty-five health workers will deliver Group Triple P and Standard Triple P in five regions, including the capital, Bucharest.

The practitioners to be trained include child psychiatrists, psychologists, nurses, and social workers, who will work from newly-established mental health centres.

Save the Children Romania is a non-government organization developing child rights programmes and parenting support services in Romania.

In addition, the non-profit organisation vzw-Oradea in Western Romania is training five practitioners to offer Triple P through its Centre for Childcare and Family Support.

Vzw-Oradea has been organizing solidarity projects in aid of children suffering from a handicap and/or social exclusion in Oradea since 1995.

Romania is the first Eastern European country to offer Triple P to its families and brings the number of countries around the world delivering Triple P to 20.

Triple P is also used in the United States, Canada, England, Scotland, Ireland, Wales, Japan, Iran, Singapore, Hong Kong, the Netherlands, Belgium, Sweden, Switzerland, Germany, Curacao, Austria, Australia and New Zealand.
